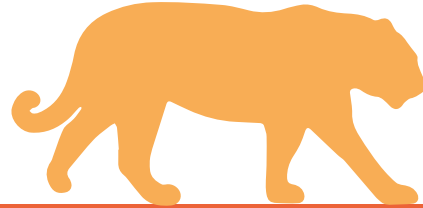




LARGE TIGER POSTER

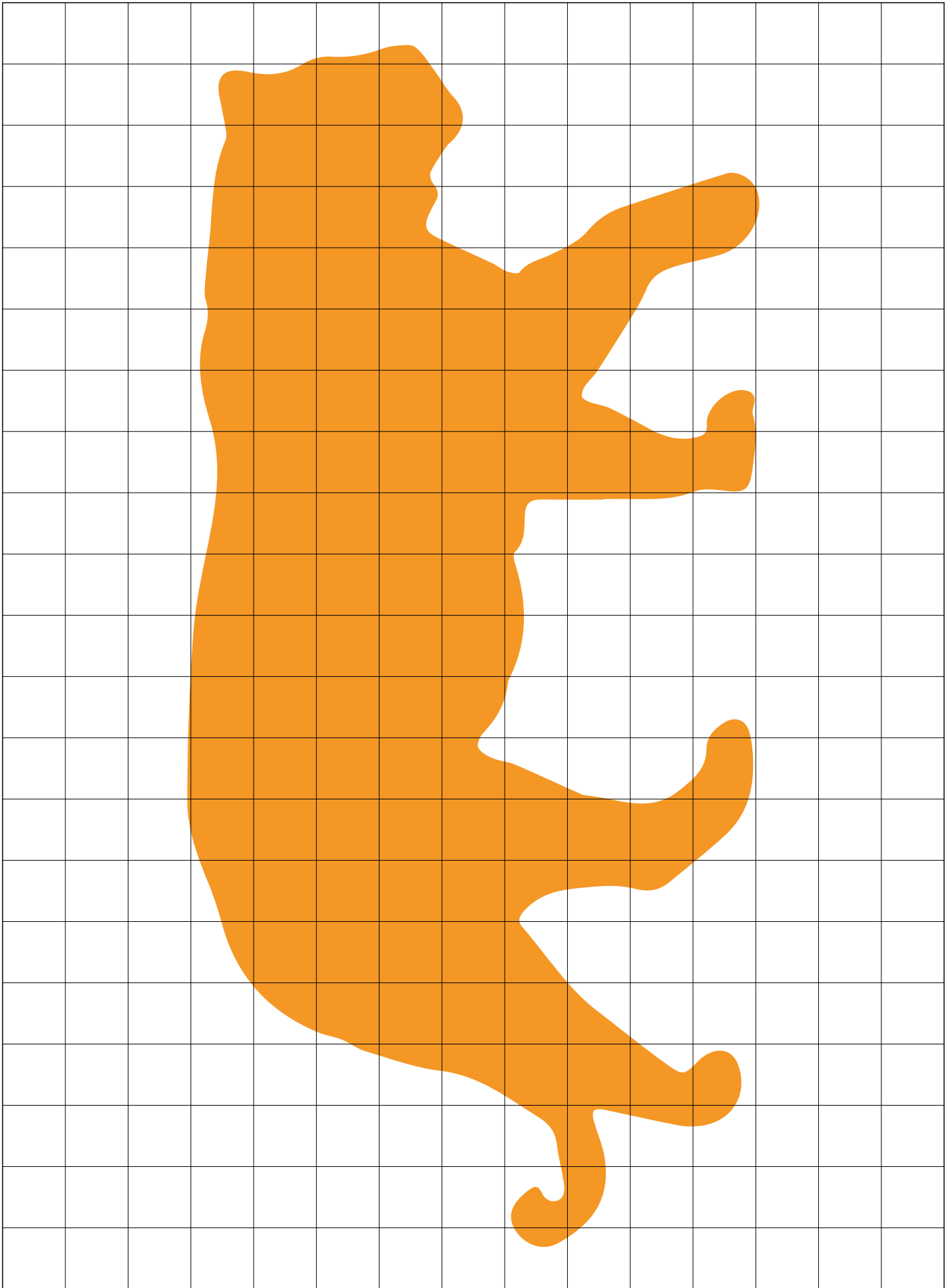
