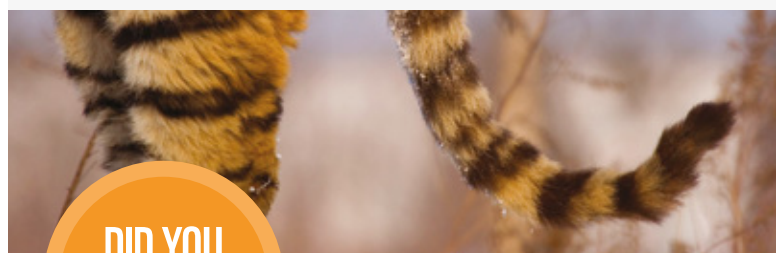

## What to do

1. Print this cute tiger door danger.
2. Carefully cut around the door hanger and the three tiger heads. You may need to ask an adult to help you.
3. Hang the tiger door hanger over the door knob by its long tail.
4. Using blue tac, stick the tiger face onto the tiger, where there is a space.
5. You can choose which face you like, to tell people how you are feeling; wide awake, sleepy or fast asleep!



## DID YOU KNOW?

A tiger's tail is between 72-109cm long depending on the which type of tiger it is, but it is usually less than half its body length.

Display your tiger poster in your meeting place, in your local village school, at home or at school.
