

HOW ARE YOU DOING?

Throughout and at the end of your project you should look at what you've achieved and think about how you could improve in the future. It's very useful for making sure your team continues to get better.

What you can do

Keeping records

Use the resource templates on School Zone. You can display the completed templates, graphics and charts up on your notice board to let people know what you have been doing.

Take photos

Make sure you take lots of photos or create a film thought out your project to show how things change and share them on School Zone website.

Evaluate

At the end of the project, look at the information you've gathered and ask yourselves the following questions:

- What did we set out to do
- What did we do?
- What went well and why?
- What could have gone better and why?
- What would we do differently next time?

Count the change

Measure your results. For example, you could record the amount of waste that's been reused or recycled, or the reduction in the amount of water and energy used by the school. If possible, work with your school caretaker to find out whether the school has saved any money from changes that have been made (for example, has the electricity bill gone down?).
