## ROE DEER

Our most common native deer forms small, loose groups in winter.

## FIELD MAPLE



Look for older twigs with corky ridges and small, grey leaf buds.

## CANDLESNUFF



It often grows through moss, in groups on dead wood.

## SCALY MALE FERN



It is an ancient-woodland-indicator plant!

## YEW TREE



An important food source for birds and mammals but are poisonous to us.

## GREEN WOODPECKER



They rarely drum to communicate and can often be seen on the ground.
